Nonorganic signs

According to Waddell, the presence of three or more of these types of nonorganic signs suggests that psychological factors may be contributing to the patient's condition.

- 1. Tenderness
- 2. Stimulation
- 3. Distraction
- 4. Regional disturbances
- 5. Overreaction only sign that requires the clinician to make a judgment based on the patient's behavior during examination.

Complaints often associated with positive Waddell signs

- 1. Tailbone pain
- 2. Pain in the entire lower extremity
- 3. Numbness in the entire lower extremity
- 4. Lower extremity giving way
- 5. No pain free spells in the past year
- 6. Intolerance to treatments
- 7. Emergency admissions to the hospital with back trouble
